A84	Can I travel along the A84 between Stirling and Callander on Sunday 29 th April 2018?
	The A84 from Chalmerston Rd roundabout to Callander closes at 0500 to General traffic.
	 For residents living off the A84 on this section of route - access onto the A84 between Callander and Stirling is permitted until 08:00. This is egress only.
	The A84 reopens between Chalmerston Rd roundabout and Callander from 1130.
	I live on the A84 between Stirling and Doune; can I get out of my property on Sunday 29 th April 2018?
	 Yes, you will be able to gain access onto the A84 and out of your property until 08:00. Dependent on your location, traffic will be directed Northbound (in the direction of running) where you can exit the route at the A873; B826; B8032 or remain North on the A84.
	I live in Stirling and I need to access the M9 to travel to Edinburgh / Glasgow; is this possible?
	 Yes, access onto the M9 is possible via Junction 10 until 08:00. Between 08:00 and 09:30, Junction 10 will be closed to allow the Marathon to pass through. Once the runners have cleared Junction 10, this will be re-opened. Or to the south of Stirling junction 9 remains open and fully operational all day.
	When will the A84 between Stirling and Callander be re-opened?
	 The A84 between Callander and Stirling will re-open at 11:30. At this time, vehicles will be permitted to travel North and South however not able to turn right onto Balkerach Street and into Doune until 12:00 midday.

Doune	Can I get out of Doune on Sunday 29th April 2018?
Dodile	 Yes, before 08:30 egress out of Doune is possible travelling East towards on the A820. Access to Keir Roundabout and the M9 can be made via the B824. At 08:30 there will be no access onto the route as the Marathon will be on its way.
	 Professional Stewards will be located at each road closure whilst the marathon is travelling through Doune.
	When will I be able to travel back into Doune on Sunday 29th April 2018?
	 At 12:00 midday, Doune will re-open from the A84 along Balkerach St; Ardoch Bank to the B824. Access will be available from the A84 (travelling East) and the B824 if travelling from Keir Roundabout.
	 Access East to Dunblane remains unavailable until 13:15.
	I am a runner living in Doune and want to drive to Stirling City Centre to park my car, is this possible?
	 Yes, access into Stirling from Doune will be permitted until 08:00 via the B824 to Keir roundabout and onto the M9, Note: junction 10 of the M9 will close from 0800 so from this time access into the City Centre for Parking will be via junction 9 and then Glasgow Rd.
Dunblane	Can I get out of Dunblane on Sunday 29 th April 2018?
	 Yes, before 08:30 egress out of Dunblane is possible traveling west on Doune Rd to the A9 at the west of the town this gives access to the A9 / M9 (North and South bound).
	 At 08:30 there will be no access onto the route through Dunblane.
	 Professional Stewards will be located at each road closure whilst the marathon is travelling through Dunblane.
	When will I be able to travel back into Dunblane on Sunday 29th April 2018?
	 At 13:15 the A820 will re-open allowing traffic from Dunblane to exit west to A9 or

	 further west to Doune and the A84. At 13:15 Doune Rd; Springfield Terrace; Stirling Rd as far as Keir roundabout will reopen to general traffic. At this time, the Old A9 leading into Bridge of Allan will remain closed. I am a runner living in Dunblane and want to drive to Stirling City Centre to park my car, is this possible?
	 Yes, access to Stirling is via the A820/A9 junction to the west of the town, this will allow traffic to use the A9/M9 to head south to Stirling. Please note that from 0800 junction 10 of the M9 will be closed and access will be via junction 9 only.
Bridge of Allan	Can I get out of Bridge of Allan on Sunday 29 th April 2018?
	 Yes, egress out of Bridge of Allan is permitted until 09:30. Dependant on location, egress can be made via Causewayhead Road and Fountain Road travelling South into Stirling. From North of Henderson St we advise using Well Rd to access the run route (Henderson St) and exiting onto Fountain Rd. After 09:30, professional stewards will be in location at every road junction preventing access onto the route. Egress East to the A91 will be permitted until 09:00 due to the A91 closure coming into place at that time to allow the Half Marathon the travel along the route safely.
	When will I be able to travel back into Bridge of Allan on Sunday 29th April 2019?
	 Access back into Bridge of Allan (Henderson Street) will be permitted at 14:30 via Fountain Road if traveling from the South (Stirling City Centre). Access from the East (Keir Roundabout via the Old A9) will be permitted at 14:30, however vehicles cannot travel West past The University of Stirling and onto Airthrey Road until 16:00.
	I am a runner living in Bridge of Allan and want to drive to Stirling City Centre to park my car, is this possible?
	If you live north of Henderson St or live directly on the route then Yes, access to

	Customs Roundabout and Stirling City Centre is available via Fountain Road or Causewayhead Road until 09:30 on Sunday 29 th April 2018 allowing access to city centre parking. If you live south of Henderson St then access to customs roundabout remains available at all times.
A91 / City Centre	I live in Menstrie / Tullibody / Alloa and need to travel into Stirling on Sunday 29 th April 2018, is this possible?
	 Yes, access onto the A91 via Hillfoots Road and Alloa Road is permitted until 09:00. You will be permitted to travel into Stirling City Centre via Millhall roundabout, forthside Way is closed for the event and the A905 to Springkerse road bridge remains available for local access only, there is no access into the City Centre due to the bridge closure. Between 09:00 and 16:00 access onto the route between Hillfoots Road and Muirton Roundabout will be closed to allow the Marathon and Half Marathon to travel safely around the route. There will be no access to the Alloa Rd west of Dumyat View roundabout during this period. At 16:00 the A91 will re-open to allow movement of traffic North and South. At 16:00 Alloa Rd will re-open to allow movement of traffic west and east. Access into Stirling via Forthside Way will remain closed until 17:00.
Customs Roundabout	Customs Roundabout will remain open throughout the duration of the event on Sunday 29 th April 2018. Access into the City Centre via Cowane Street / Goosecroft Road will be restricted between 09:00 and 18:00 however, diversion routes will be in place to allow egress and ingress throughout the day.
Muirton Roundabout	Muirton Roundabout will remain partly open throughout the duration of the event, allowing traffic to access Springkerse Retail Park from the South. Controlled traffic management measures will be in place to ensure clear messaging on the day. Muirton Roundabout will re-open at 16:00 to allow movement of traffic North and South on the
Keir Roundabout	A91. At this time Forthside Way remains closed until 17:00. Keir Roundabout will remain open throughout the duration of the event on Sunday 29 th April 2018 for vehicle movement North & South on the M9 / A9. There will be traffic management in
	place on the south bound approach to assit with regulating traffic onto the roundabout in a safe manner.

	Vehicles will not be able to access Stirling Road and travel into Dunblane until 13:15 or the Old A9 into Bridge of Allan until 14:30. At 14:40 there is no through road to the A91 until 1600, traffic transiting through the area will be diverted south to Stirling until 16:00 when the Airthery Rd/Alloa Rd and A91 are re-opened.
Emergency Vehicle Access	Access onto any part of the Marathon route will be permitted for any Blue Light Emergency service throughout the duration of the event. This will be managed via professional stewards on the ground in conjunction with the emergency service needing access. Communication will be maintained via the event control room to ensure safety for the runners and members of the public.
